Hi everyone! I wanted to start this week's chat with a note about code enforcement, and my attempt to be more aggressive in certain situations. I've heard from many of you about houses with fire damage, beached buses, old trucks, illegally parked cars, and abandoned commercial buildings within our community. In almost every case, the property is owned by someone who doesn't live in Waupun, and seems to have an "out of sight, out of mind" attitude. I assure you; we will be taking a more aggressive role in helping to keep Waupun a beautiful city, and that includes creating a part time job for code enforcement. The city council approved the creation of a Code Enforcement Officer because we all agree having buildings growing weeds and rats only hurts the ascetics and value of our community. We will keep Waupun a great looking place to live, work and play!

Speaking of code enforcement, I would like to remind everyone of their responsibility in taking care of diseased, dying or dead trees. With the number of dying Ash trees in our community we are aggressively informing home owners of the need to have the trees removed. Why? For a couple reasons, but mainly that a dead tree has a high likelihood of coming down in a wind event causing bodily harm and damage. It's also a major concern along the Rock River, as down trees block the waterway from use for recreational users of our river. We have many great local tree removal services, so please check on your tree's health.

In exciting economic development news, our City Administrator and Director of Economic Development, Kathy Schelive, announced that United Corporative will be developing an agribusiness facility to be constructed in our industrial park. This \$100 million/65-acre project will create some 50 new jobs, create more tax base, and hopefully help us connect Shaler Dr. I'd like to personally thank Kathy, and city attorney Dan Vande Zande for the countless hours they put into making this project a reality. Waupun owes them both a debt of graduate.

Finally, while the Cubs may be struggling this season, there's really fun and exciting baseball being played at our baseball complex all Summer long. With Waupun hosting the tournaments for high school, along with the Waupun Post 210 Legion teams, I encourage you to get out to the ballpark. Delicious concessions, cold drinks, and good baseball. I'd be remiss if I didn't mention that on Thursday nights at McCune you can watch some fun Women's Softball League. So come on out, enjoy the late evenings, and as Harry Caray used to say, "It's a beautiful day for a ballgame, and you can't be fun at the ol' ballpark!" Holy Cow!
