Waupunites came together over the past several weeks and rallied around something we believed in; being the City of Sculpture!

An overflow crowd of people attended our council meeting to make it clear they want the Shaler Sculptures on our new wayfinding signs, along with the End of the Trail and "City of Sculpture" on our new 'Welcome to Waupun' signage.

During this month-long debate, efforts were made to bring in outsiders to cause trouble, to hurl allegations of being racially insensitive, to threaten legal action if we were to use the EOT as one of our city's logos. But those efforts have failed, because this community loves that sculpture!

The next step is to get sticker silhouettes of the Shaler Sculptures to cover the 'crop logo' on the new wayfinding signs, but because we're doing all the sculptures, and not just the EOT, the cost of the stickers doubled, however, Steve Guth and Mark Homan both pledged to help cover the cost, and after that was announced, most of the people in attendance raised their hands, and offered to help pay for them!

It's awesome that our community loves our sculptures so much, that people are willing to donate money to keep them as our welcoming logo to our guests!

The End of the Trail sculpture is a beautiful and emotional sculpture! It means different things to people of different heritages, and while it does tell the story of the plight of the Native American-he's reached the End of the Trail- it also tells the story of Clerance Shaler, and his remarkable gifts to Waupun.

The EOT is not a mascot. There is nothing about that sculpture that in anyway demeans, looks down upon, or makes fun of Native American culture. The sculpture reminds us of what happened to Native Americans, and it is important that we remember-and honor-their history, in our American history!

Mr. Shaler started the Shaler Company, now National Rivet, a legacy company still located in Waupun. He helped start the country club, and was a philanthropist for Waupun, with no bigger gifts than those of our sculptures. Moving forward, I would like to use the Shaler and Harris Park area to host Native American themed festivals, like an art fair. And while I'm not sure yet how to that, I think it's important we try. Going all the way back to Waupun's founding by Seymor Wilcox, our community had a peaceful and friendly relationship with the local natives. That's a history worth celebrating, and that is why Waupun is the perfect city to display the End of the Trail sculpture! Thank you, Waupun, for your support, and for not backing down! Together, we're saving Mr. Shaler's legacy, while honoring those people who came before us.

Accelerated Clinical Laboratories will be providing mobile COVID-19 testing onsite at the Fond du Lac County Fairgrounds (520 Fond du lac Ave) on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays & Fridays from 8AM -4:30PM. Drive-thru only. As a reminder, anyone ages 2 or older can utilize these testing sites. Symptoms are not required. No appointments, insurance, or identification is required. Pre-registering may speed up your visit; individuals can pre-register at https://register.covidconnect.wi.gov/en-US/.
