## From the Waupun Mayor -

Hi everybody!

While the city logo/branding issue has attracted the most media attention, there's lots of other issues we've been dealing with and I'm going to go through them here. Hopefully bringing you up to speed or maybe clarifying a rumor you may have heard.

First, The next "big issue" will be spending our ARPA funds that Waupun received from the federal government for COVID relief and recovery. In my opinion those funds should be used to do the most good for the most people. With that in mind, my proposal to the council would be to spend the money this way:

\$500,000 baseball complex-turf replacement

\$250,000 Child Care expansion

\$30,000 climbing wall

\$34,000 stop light

\$125,000 Shaler ADA

\$35,000 Dodge Park

\$200,000 senior center overruns

Why? This does the most good for the most people. I'll break it down:

BASEBALL: Waupun has an awesome baseball complex that hosts several leagues and many tournaments. Including Little League, high school, and Legion baseball. Those tournaments bring hundreds of people to Waupun several weekends a Summer. Those people spend the night, eat lunch, shop, and are good for our local economy. And baseball is a great youth activity, with hundreds of kids taking advantage of our baseball complex every year, from tee ball through legion ball. What makes our complex so unique and able to host so many tournaments is the awesome turf that's very weather resistant. If we didn't have that turf, we wouldn't have the tournaments, and the turf is beginning to wear out.

I know some of you are thinking, 'make the school pay for some of it, they use it too!" That's a fair point, but let's face it, they're broke, and the same taxpayers support both the city and school, so let's just get this done and playball!

CHILDCARE: Waupun, like everyone else, is facing a child care shortage, and if we can help a local day care expand or help bring in a second child care center, we need to try! Too many working families don't have access to quality childcare. I'm committed to tackling this issue, even though it's extremely difficult.

CLIMBING WALL: Our aquatic center is a very popular Summer destination and a climbing wall is another fun thing for the kids. Keeping our kids busy during the Summer helps to keep them out of trouble.

STOP LIGHT: The Main and Madison stop light is nearing a replacement. It's our busiest intersection. Let's just get er done.

SHALER ADA: The Veterans' wall at Shaler Park isn't exactly disability friendly. Many of our older veterans are disabled. I think it's the least we could do to make sure our heroes have access to their wall.

DODGE PARK: The tennis court is shot and needs to be replaced. This is one way to pay for it. I don't know if it should stay just a tennis court, with the popularity of Pickle Ball, but whatever we decide to do with it, this gets it done. And again, giving people recreational opportunities is good for one's mental health, and helps to keep Waupun a great place to live.

SENIOR CENTER: As we're drawing up the plans, many of us are committed to doing this right, and making sure this can also be a center used by the entire community. I love the idea of housing REACH and the food pantry in this new building, but doing so will drive up the cost. This is a way to hold some funds back to cover those costs. So, those will be my recommendations as to how we spend your federal tax dollars in Waupun. I know there will be some 11,264 different opinions, but I am trying to do the most good for the most people. In the end, the council gets the final decision, so make your voice heard!

Other issues going on:

Last week, I did get a concern that Waupun Correctional Institution was going to be closing Tower 1 on weekends. This was worrisome because that is the main tower and we do want to make sure city residents are safe. After reaching out to Warden Randy Hepp, we learned that WCI is NOT closing that tower.

Next, I occasionally get asked about the Saturday "Noon Whistle" and why it sounds for so long. The answer is that it's the county wide test. All sirens in Fond du Lac County sound at noon on Saturday for three minutes. This allows for the mechanism in the siren to stay lubricated, and for officials to make sure the sounding software is working properly. We'd rather something fail at Noon on Saturday than during a Tornado warned storm. You may

remember, we used to sound the siren every day at noon, that was changed several years ago to only Wednesday's growl test and the Saturday county wide test.

The next question I received was why is Windmill the never going? I do have a couple people willing to volunteer to operate and help maintain it. We'll see what happens!

Reminder, the railroad crossing at Main Street is scheduled to be replaced next year!

Volksfeast is returning! Saturday September 10 at the Waupun Community Center. Volksfeast has been taken over by the Waupun Hockey Club, and I hope to see you their!

Prisoners in the Park. You may remember that about a month ago I learned that county vehicles who are waiting to drop off incoming inmates to the Dodge Correctional Institution were using Dodge Park as the restroom for prisoners who needed to go. We had troubling pictures of cuffed and shackled prisoners being escorted by armed deputies through a park full of kids. Obviously, this isn't ideal.

I reached out to Warden Benzel at DCI and he agreed that a park isn't a good a place for prisoners. I then talked to Senator Feyen who called Department of Corrections Secretary Kevin Carr. An email has been sent to all Sheriff's in Wisconsin asking them not to use Dodge park for a prisoner's restrooms. They were instructed to use any jail, or any correctional facility in Waupun if the inmate needs to relieve himself.

Please remember bulk pick-up is for large items that do not fit in a garbage or recycling container. Waste Management will be providing three 30 yard containers for wood related items only during bulk pick up as well. The dumpsters will be located at the Department of Public Works Garage, at 903 N. Madison St. The days and hours of operation will be Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday from 8am to 3pm during the bulk pickup days only. Residents will be required to show proof of residency. **OCTOBER 10 – NOVEMBER 14 SPRING YARD WASTE PICKUP:** The City's Fall Yard Waste pick-up is designated for October 10, 2022 thru November 14, 2022 (weather permitting). This service is for the disposal of leaves, grass, garden waste, and branches that are generated from routine yard maintenance. Leaves and brush shall not be deposited on the street. Leave grass clippings and leaves at the curbside loose, do not bag. Separate leaf piles and brush piles. Branches shall not exceed 3 inches in diameter. No tree stumps or tree root systems will be collected. The service is not intended for tree removal or lot cleaning.

Accelerated Clinical Laboratories will be providing mobile COVID-19 testing onsite at the Fond du Lac County Fairgrounds (520 Fond du lac Ave) on **Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays & Fridays from 8AM -4:30PM**. Drive-thru only. As a reminder, anyone ages 2 or older can utilize these testing sites. Symptoms are not required. No appointments, insurance, or identification is required. Pre-registering may speed up your visit; individuals can pre-register at https://register.covidconnect.wi.gov/en-US/.
