# From the Waupun Mayor -

Hi Everybody!

Happy Labor Day Weekend! Speaking of Labor Day, I want to thank all the hard-working men and women who labor for the City of Waupun. These hard-working folks do a lot to help keep Waupun a great city to live, work, and play in. We take it for granted that we have such a committed team working for us, but when we receive five inches of rain in half an hour, or there's a power outage, gas leak, severe storm, blizzard, or big event, it's our city staff who go into work afterhours. So, on behalf of a grateful community, I'd like to thank all our city and utility employees for all they do to make Waupun the greatest little city in Wisconsin!

Speaking of Wisconsin's greatest little city, it's remarkable a city of our size is able to host America's original "Salute to the Trucking Industry," and has done so for over 30 years! This year, I had the honor of speaking at the opening ceremony that honored one of the event founders and longtime president, Ron VandeZande, and I was able to surprise a driver with the "Mayor's Choice Award!" This event, unique to Waupun, raises thousands of dollars for both REACH Waupun and the Make-A-Wish foundation. Well, time takes a toll and many of the original members of the "Truckers Jamboree" board have passed on, and many of the members of the "Truck-N-Show" board are retiring for several reasons. The annual show is in danger of NOT happening in 2023! So, if you have any interest and the ability to help out, please attend their next meeting on September 17, at 8am at FVS Bank. Otherwise, it's likely to be cancelled for next year.

The Common Council did meet on Tuesday where we went over the surveys that the alderman filled out regarding their priorities for the ARPA funding. In my opinion, those surveys are now mostly useless, because since my August 20 column, the city has been inundated with request from just about every youth sport in Waupun. Request include baseball, the turf is wearing out, the hockey cooling system is wearing out, Waupun Soccer would like a complex, Warrior Football would like help with replacing the lights, and we even received a request for rehabbing McCune Beach.

We hadn't considered most of these options until after my column informed people we were beginning the process of how to distribute these funds. This is a good thing! I've said all along that there will be 11,264 opinions as to how to allocate these funds, and I am committed to doing this in the most transparent way.

The next step will be a series of listening sessions to gage public input. Then the council will have to decide how to allocate these funds. As for me, my priorities will continue to try and do the most good for the most people. I will keep pushing to try and use most of the ARPA funds for; child care expansion, new senior center cost overruns likely to occur if we include REACH and the food pantry into the building, making the Veterans' Wall ADA compliant, replacing the Main and Madison traffic signal, adding a rock climbing wall at the aquatic center, and splitting up about \$750,000 to the different sports.

Speaking of sports, I'm really intrigued with repurposing Veterans' Memorial Field. As everyone knows, a light pole blew over forcing day games for this season. Replacing the lights is very expensive. I wonder if this situation opens up an opportunity to move the football games to the current high school campus, and we can turn Veteran's Field into a festival grounds. A place to host Celebrate Waupun, Volksfest, and be home to a new soccer complex? Doing this would allow the city to turn over ownership of the community center to Waupun Hockey, allowing hockey to have year-round ice, and for Waupun soccer to have a permeant home. I don't know if this will happen, but this is the time to consider all options.

I ask that everyone stay positive during this process. Waupun has many needs and good causes, and we can't do everything.

A picture will be taken of the remaining items, and you will have 3 days to remove them. Please remember bulk pick-up is for large items that do not fit in a garbage or recycling container. Waste Management will be providing three 30 yard containers for wood related items only during bulk pick up as well. The dumpsters will be located at the Department of Public Works Garage, at 903 N. Madison St. The days and hours of operation will be Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday from 8am to 3pm during the bulk pickup days

# FREE COVID-19 TESTING

Fond du Lac County Health Department is offering <u>FREE COVID-19 testing for all residents ages 2 and older</u>. Accelerated Clinical Laboratories will be providing mobile COVID-19 testing onsite at the Fond du Lac County Fairgrounds (520 Fond du lac Ave) on **Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays & Fridays from 8AM -4:30PM**. Drive-thru only. As a reminder, anyone ages 2 or older can utilize these testing sites. Symptoms are not required. No appointments, insurance, or identification is required. Pre-registering may speed up your visit; individuals can pre-register at https://register.covidconnect.wi.gov/en-US/. Individuals may find additional testing sites within Fond du Lac County by visiting our website, or throughout the state by visiting the DHS website.

To qualify your pharmacist must agree, and you must pay the cost of your medications (if any) over the telephone or internet. But Waupun Taxi will not add on any extra charge for the delivery. Call your pharmacist.
