

From the Waupun Mayor –

Hi everyone!

Well, it's Fall and that means bulk pickup is right around the corner. We don't want Waupun looking dumpy, so I ask that you not haul your stuff out until the week of bulk pickup, which is October 3, 4, & 5. Also, remember if the stuff will fit in the garbage can, please put it in it! You can read more details about bulk pickup below in the calendar of events.

There is work being done at the intersection of Main and Watertown Streets to address flooding that has been taking place during heavy rains. DPW head Jeff Danne had the sewer videoed to see what was causing the flooding and discovered AT&T had some underground fiberoptic cables that have been causing the storm water sewer to fill up with debris. The debris is causing water to backup and flood the street. The construction project won't last long, and it is AT&T's responsibility. I'm glad they are being a good community partner and addressing this situation.

The annual yard cleanup will begin October 10th.

This week I had the honor of attending a cookout at Harris Mill Park to thank the DPW crew for their hard work and dedication to the City of Waupun. They do a fantastic job and we're fortunate to have such a dedicated crew. They do a lot of work that people don't notice because we take it for granted.

On Monday morning, Kathy Schlieve and I attended a legislative forum hosted by Envision Greater Fond du Lac, where we again stressed the importance of the staffing shortage at Waupun Correctional and the effects it's now having on the broader community, both from a safety standpoint as well as with our sewer utility. We also had a good discussion about shortages in child care and some long term and short-term ideas to help.

Last week, Kathy and I met with WASD Administrator Steven Hill to discuss options regarding youth sports, specifically the city and school district working together to move football games to the current school, and to repurpose the current field as a soccer complex or a festival area. No decisions have been made, and this is just preliminary talks as we kick around every option we have. We have a unique opportunity and it's important that we consider every option. I don't want to be five years down the road and saying, "we should have.." I'll keep you posted.

October 14 & 15 – the Waupun Community Players are performing at the city hall auditorium. It's a Musical, Comedy Murders of 1940. Also, that weekend will be the annual "Kickin for Kevin" kickball tournament and fundraiser! It's always a great time and I hope to see you out!

On October 21st, the Waupun Hockey Association will be hosting this year's Hockey Unlimited to help support hockey in Waupun, Hockey has a long and great tradition here, and it's something Waupun can be proud of.

OCTOBER 3, 4, & 5 BULK PICK-UP - The Fall bulk item pick-up with Waste Management will be held the week of October 3, 2022. Bulk items should be picked up on your normal trash pick-up date. Items may not be placed at the curb prior than 24 hours to your scheduled pick-up date. If items do not meet bulk pick-up guidelines a door-hanger will be hung the day of pick-up. A picture will be taken of the remaining items, and you will have 3 days to remove them. Please remember bulk pick-up is for large items that do not fit in a garbage or recycling container. Waste Management will be providing three 30 yard containers for wood related items only during bulk pick up as well. The dumpsters will be located at the Department of Public Works Garage, at 903 N. Madison St. The days and hours of operation will be Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday from 8am to 3pm during the bulk pickup days only. Residents will be required to show proof of residency. This service is for the disposal of leaves, grass, garden waste, and branches that are generated from routine yard maintenance. Leaves and brush shall not be deposited on the street. Leave grass clippings and leaves at the curbside loose, do not bag. Separate leaf piles and brush piles. Branches shall not exceed 3 inches in diameter. No tree stumps or tree root systems will be collected. The service is not intended for tree removal or lot cleaning.

FREE COVID-19 TESTING

Fond du Lac County Health Department is offering FREE COVID-19 testing for all residents ages 2 and older.

Accelerated Clinical Laboratories will be providing mobile COVID-19 testing onsite at the Fond du Lac County Fairgrounds (520 Fond du lac Ave) on **Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays & Fridays from 8AM -4:30PM.** Drive-thru only. As a reminder, anyone ages 2 or older can utilize these testing sites. Symptoms are not required. No appointments, insurance, or identification is required. Pre-registering may speed up your visit; individuals can pre-register at <https://register.covidconnect.wi.gov/en-US/>. Individuals may find additional testing sites within Fond du Lac County by visiting our website, or throughout the state by visiting the DHS website.

During this public health emergency Waupun Taxi is allowed to make certain pharmaceutical deliveries. Ask your pharmacist if your medications can be delivered. No charge for the delivery service. To qualify your pharmacist must agree, and you must pay the cost of your medications (if any) over the telephone or internet. But Waupun Taxi will not add on any extra charge for the delivery. Call your pharmacist.

AFFORDABLE TRANSPORTATION AVAILABLE FOR AGE 60+:

We can take you anywhere within the city limits of Waupun with the exception of the laundromat or pet-related places. We can take you to doctor appointments, hair appointments, grocery shopping, to restaurants, to banks, to the library, to anywhere! Transportation for ages 60+ within the city limits of Waupun. Multiple stops can be scheduled in 15-minute or more increments. Riders must be able to navigate two steps safely to board the vehicle. Van can seat up to nine passengers. Cost: \$1 each stop. Rides must be scheduled the day before by noon by calling 324-7930. Rides can be scheduled as early as 9AM. The last non-medical ride is at 2PM and the last medical ride appointment is at 3PM.
