

From the Waupun Mayor –

Hello Waupun!

A year ago this weekend we came together as a community to celebrate the centennial of Waupun's oldest sculpture, the Recording Angel. The Angel was donated to Waupun in October 1923 as a tribute to the late Mrs. Shaler and a gift to our community. Over the next several years, Mr. Shaler would donate five sculptures. In the late 1990's, Waupun would acquire two more of Mr. Shaler's works and add them to our collection, what we now call the Shaler Legacy Collection.

Today, we again come together as a community to celebrate. This year we gather to open our new Food Truck Alley, unveil a mural, and kick off our new sculpture tours.

The new sculptures will rotate annually, unless they are purchased. A few weeks ago, I wrote about an effort by Steve Biever at the Historical Society to try and raise enough money to purchase "We Can Do It" also known as "Rosie the Riveter" and to keep her here in Waupun. As many of you know, National Rivet and Waupun played a key role in World War 2, making the rivets for the war effort. In fact, National Rivet had a military protective permit around it, with a check point to get in or out.

I'm super excited to announce the **We Can Do It, Community Challenge**. A joint effort to raise the necessary funds to keep Rosie in Waupun. National Rivet has graciously offered to donate half the cost of keeping Rosie, so we're hoping to raise the other half. Roughly \$15,500. Basically, we need 155 people to give \$100. Or 5 people to give \$1,000. I know we can do this, because we are Waupun, and we take a lot of pride in our history. To learn more please attend our ribbon cutting events this morning at 10 at the new Food Truck Alley downtown! They'll be a delicious food truck, along with everything else that our downtown has to offer on a Saturday morning. I sure hope I see you there!

In other news, we're waiting on a part to repair the dam. Once the part is in, Public Works will get it fixed. Thank you to Waupun Utilities for helping out with the use of a water pump. And thank you to the residents of Waupun who helped to clean up along the river while the water level is so low.

The railroad crossing at Brown Street has been repaired. This means we've had Main Street, Lincoln Street, Brown Street, repaired, and the Taylor/Jackson crossing patched up.

Bulk pickup has ended for the season. If you were late getting your stuff out, please remove it. I should add that since changing to GFL for city garbage, garbage services have been delivered really well, and I'm thankful to GFL for their services.

The fall yard waste season begins this week, although with the weather we haven't had many leaves fall yet, but we know they will.

Finally, I had a lot of fun riding in the homecoming parade. Thank you to WASD for having me.

NOVEMBER 5 2024 GENERAL ELECTION:

In Person Voting:

Tuesday, October 22 through Thursday, October 31 – 8AM to 4PM

Friday, November 1 – 8AM to 5PM

*Must be registered

*Must provide a photo ID

Request an Absentee Ballot by mailed:

Deadline to request a ballot be mailed (5th day prior to election) Thursday, October 31, 2024 at 5PM.

There are several ways registered voters can request absentee ballots.

1) ON-LINE: If they have internet access, the easiest way is to sign up at MyVote Wisconsin, <https://myvote.wi.gov>. Just look for the “Vote Absentee” button near the top of the page. On a mobile phone, use the menu button in the upper right corner of the website. There is a three-step process that starts with putting in your name and date of birth, followed by requesting your ballot. If you don’t already have a photo ID on file with your clerk’s office, you can upload a copy. Mobile phone users can take a picture and upload it to MyVote. Absentee ballot requests submitted this way go directly to your clerk’s office, and you can track your ballot by returning to the website.

2) BY MAIL: Voters can also request absentee ballots by mail (Military and Permanent Overseas may request by Email or fax) from their municipal clerk’s office. You can find your clerk’s contact information on MyVote Wisconsin. These requests **must be accompanied by a copy of your photo ID**. If you already have a photo ID on file from previous absentee requests under your current registration, you will not need to provide it again.

Voters who are indefinitely confined, meaning they may have difficulty getting to the polls for reason of age, illness, infirmity, or disability are not required to provide a photo ID. Voters in care facilities can have a representative of the facility confirm the resident's identity instead of providing a photo ID. More information on photo ID and exemptions can be found at bringit.wi.gov.

The deadline for registered voters to request an absentee ballot be mailed to you is the Thursday before the election.

Your absentee ballot must be received in your clerk’s office or at your polling place by 8 p.m. on Election Day.

VOTING ON ELECTION DAY:

Polling Location – (New) Waupun Community Center, 520 McKinley Street

Hours – 7AM to 8PM

VOTER REGISTRATION:

Voter registration is required in the City of Waupun before an elector is allowed to vote. A qualified elector is a U.S. Citizen, at least 18 years of age, having resided in the election district for at least 28 days.

An elector can register:

1. **Online** at [MyVoteWI](https://myvote.wi.gov),
2. **In person** in the office of the City Clerk (201 E Main Street, Waupun WI 53963),
3. **At the polling place** on Election Day,
4. **By mail** (City Clerk 201 E Main Street, Waupun WI 53963)

OCTOBER 7 – NOVEMBER 11 FALL YARD WASTE PICKUP: The City’s Fall Yard Waste pick-up is designated for October 7, 2024 thru November 11, 2024 (weather permitting). This service is for the disposal of leaves, grass, garden waste, and branches that are generated from routine yard maintenance. Leaves and brush shall not be deposited on the street. Leave grass clippings and leaves at the curbside loose, do not bag. Separate leaf piles and brush piles. Branches shall not exceed 3 inches in diameter. No tree stumps or tree root systems will be collected. The service is not intended for tree removal or lot cleaning.
