Hello Waupun!

Last week the council approved a \$15,000 Scope of Services agreement with VandeWalle for an Affordable Housing Strategy to be done for the City of Waupun. On Thursday I vetoed the agreement, sending it back to the Common Council in April for further review.

While I am a strong supporter of new housing opportunities due to housing shortages and lack of affordability, I believe this decision needs community review and input. The agenda packet, which included the Vandwalle and Associates Inc. Scope of Services agreement was released on Friday for approval the following Tuesday. It was also presented at the Committee of the Whole which does not allow for public input. There have been comments and concerns posted to social media which has also caused confusion and fear that we're bringing low income subitized housing.

My veto sends the housing study back to the common council for their override consideration at the April meeting. It also gives all of us, and you more time to ask questions and learn what the study is looking to accomplish.

I also have a concern that we're approving a \$15,000 study that is going to tell us what we already know; that we have a housing shortage. I will pledge to you that I will NOT be the Mayor who turns Waupun into Fond du Lac South. We are a very safe and well-kept city, and I'm committed to keeping it so. That is why I have directed city staff to be more aggressive with code enforcement. It's why we're now cracking down on slum lord properties, working on an ordinance to track empty properties, and are investing so much into a vibrate and busy downtown.

As for the timeline for the original passage, I'll take responsibility and the blame for it. I've been getting very frustrated, (probably more than I should be) at how dang slow government works, and my reaction is pushing too hard and too fast. This issue needs more time to be considered, and this veto will do just that.

Speaking of the frustrations I've had with how hard and slow government works, I'll use the example of a new stop sign. In early February, a constituent asked me for a stop sign at an uncontrolled intersection. I said, "Sure, we can do that." Thinking to myself that shouldn't be hard, and we already own stop signs.... Well, there's a process. First, the stop sign request has to go to the Police Department to research the crash history of the intersection. Then it goes to the Public Works Board, where an alderman asked about a Yield sign versus a Stop sign. Then that same alderman was concerned about the cost of installing the stop sign, and after 15 minutes or so, the board approved the stop sign request, that sent it to the March Council Meeting.

At the March Council Meeting I explained to the council where the Stop sign request came from and why. The council quickly approved the sign, but wait! We now have to approve an ordinance to give the Stop sing authority to stop you, and then that must be added to our ordinance book, and that's not cheap.

Here's the good news! We're changing the process to streamline a future sign request. If the Board of Public Works and Council approve a new Stop sign, the sign will automatically have the authority to Stop cars, saving us both time and money.

When I look frustrated and tired, that Stop sign is just one of many stories I could tell. I try really hard to have the city working for you and give this job all I have.

What's on my ballot?

Access https://myvote.wi.gov/en-us/ and click on the WHATS ON MY BALLOT tile Where do I vote and what are the hours of voting on Election Day?

Voting is held at the City Hall, located at 201 E Main Street. You may take the steps to enter the front of City Hall or enter the lower level-west entrance door to access the elevator. Voting hours are 7:00am to 8:00pm.

Can I vote early in-person?

Yes, you may vote in person in the City Hall Clerk's Office from March 18-28, 2025 Monday-Friday (8:00am to 4:00pm) and March 28 (8:00am to 5:00pm)

What is the last day I can vote early in-person?

The last day you can vote early in-person is Friday, March 28, 2025 by 5pm

Can I get a ballot mailed to me?

Yes, there are several ways you can request a ballot be mailed to you:

- 1. Access https://myvote.wi.gov/en-us/ and click on Vote Absentee
- 2. Complete the WI Elections Commission Absentee Ballot Request form and return it to the City Clerk https://elections.wi.gov/search/node?keys=el-121
- 3. Email the City Clerk angie@cityofwaupun.org making a request for a ballot be mailed to you. Provide your full name, Waupun address, date of birth and the full address of where you would like it mailed. If we do not have a copy of your photo ID on file, you will receive an email making request for the document before a ballot can be placed in the mail.

What is the last date I can request an absentee ballot be mailed to me?

The last date you can request for a ballot be mailed to you is Thursday, March 27 by 5:00pm

How do I return the absentee ballot that was mailed to me?

There are several ways to return your voted ballot:

- 1. Postal Mail. When the Clerk mails you the ballot, included is a return envelope which postage is already applied. Be sure to have your signature and the signature/address of your witness on the exterior of the return envelope or it will be returned to you.
- 2. In-person. You may return <u>YOUR</u> voted ballot in the sealed return envelope **during** the City Clerk office hours (Monday-Friday 8:00am-4:00pm).

When do I have to have my absentee ballot to the City Clerk to be counted?

Your voted ballot, with your signature and the signature/address of your witness on the exterior of the return envelope, must be in the hands of the Clerk, no later than 8:00pm on Election Day.

MARCH 31, APRIL 1, APRIL 2 BULK PICK-UP - The Spring bulk item pick-up with Advanced Disposal Services will be held the week of March 31 2025. Bulk items should be picked up on your normal trash pick-up date. Items may not be placed at the curb prior than 24 hours to your scheduled pick-up date. If items do not meet bulk pick-up guidelines a door- hanger will be hung the day of pick-up. A picture will be taken of the remaining items, and you will have 3 days to remove them. Please remember bulk pick-up is for large items that do not fit in a garbage or recycling container. Waste Management will be providing three 30 yard containers for wood related items only during bulk pick up as well. The dumpsters will be located at the Department of Public Works Garage, at 903 N. Madison St. The days and hours of operation will be Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday from 8am to 3pm during the bulk pickup days only. Residents will be required to show proof of residency. Material other than wood related items, will not be accepted and will be turned away. You may check out the guidelines for what is considered bulk on our City web-site at www.cityofwaupun.org.

Wisconsin's Tornado and Severe Weather Awareness Week has been designated for April 7-11, 2025. The Statewide Tornado Drill will be Thursday, April 10th, with a mock "Tornado Warning" issued at approximately 1:45PM. The drill will conclude at 2:00PM. A second drill will be conducted later in the day with a mock "Tornado Warning" being issued at 6:45PM. Having two drills allows people to practice at work, school, and at home. If severe weather is present in the State on this date, the drill will be held at approximately the same time on Friday,

April 11th. If severe weather persists through Friday, the drill will be cancelled. Remember, the City of Waupun NEVER sounds sirens for an all-clear signal.

APRIL 7- MAY 5 2025 SPRING YARD WASTE PICKUP: The City's Spring Yard Waste pick-up is designated for April 7, 2025 thru May 5, 2025 (weather permitting). This service is for the disposal of leaves, grass, garden waste, and branches that are generated from routine yard maintenance. Leaves and brush shall not be deposited on the street. Leave grass clippings and leaves at the curbside loose, do not bag. Separate leaf piles and brush piles. Branches shall not exceed 3 inches in diameter. No tree stumps or tree root systems will be collected. The service is not intended for tree removal or lot cleaning.

WINTER PARKING REGULATIONS - states that for a period of 48 hours immediately following an accumulated snowfall of two inches or more, vehicles cannot park on city streets or alleys between the hours of 2:00am and 6:00am. Snowfall is measured at the Waupun Safety Building. During these early morning hours the Public Works Department is out cleaning the streets. If cars are parked on the streets during this time City staff has the authority to have the vehicle removed and stored at the owners expense. For further information regarding winter parking regulations please visit the city website www.cityofwaupun.org (Government, Municipal Codes), and review Chapter 6, Traffic Code section 6.05(5).

SNOW AND ICE REMOVAL is addressed in Chapter 7 of our municipal code. Property owners are given 24 hours after the end of a snowfall to remove snow and ice from sidewalks. Failure to do so is cause for the city to clean up the area and will result in a minimum fee of \$100.00. The City provides notice of these winter rules in the local paper and will put door hangers on any property they have to clean up. Pictures of the property are taken before the property is cleaned for verification of violation. Visit the city website, and review Chapter 7, sections 7.07 and 7.08 for additional information on snow and ice removal requirements. You can also call City Hall or the Police Department for further clarification.
